Job Title: Field Technician - Overstory Crew Member (6-8 positions)
Agency: Purdue University – Dept. of Forestry & Natural Resources

Overstory Crew Members will help carry out research on the effects of silvicultural treatments on the ecology of managed forests as part of the Hardwood Ecosystem Experiment (HEE) near Bloomington, IN. The primary duty for these positions will be to conduct vegetation surveys including measurement and identification of overstory trees, saplings, and seedlings as well as shrubs. Sampling of forest insects and moths may also be required at certain times throughout the field season.

Qualifications:

Required

- Field or classroom experience conducting forest inventories
- Strong tree and shrub identification skills
- Valid driver's license with a good driving record
- Willingness to work in extreme conditions, including traversing rugged terrain through dense, thorny shrubs and working in high temperatures and high humidity

Preferred

- Experience with tree and shrub identification in the Midwest
- Experience with hand-held GPS units, maps and compass

Each work week will generally consist of four 10-hour days in summer months. Work will not exceed 40 hours in a week. *Start and end dates are somewhat flexible depending on school schedules.* Please contact Charlotte Owings (freemac@purdue.edu) for specific questions.
